In reading we are learning to:

Writing

In writing we are learning to:

- Use the first two or three letters of a word to check the spelling in a dictionary •
 - Join letters together where appropriate
- Draft and write by composing and rehearsing sentences orally, progressively building a varied and rich vocabulary and an increasing range of sentence structures
- Draft and write by creating settings, characters • and plot in narratives
- Proofread for spelling and punctuation errors •
- Develop sentences by using fronted adverbials
- Use the correct grammatical form of verbs •
- Choose appropriate and nouns or pronouns for clarity and cohesion in sentences
- Draft and write independently and use rich • vocabulary and a range of sentence structures
- Independently use organisational devices such • as headings and subheadings in a range of contexts
- To know the difference between standard forms of verbs and spoken forms of verbs

- Use number knowledge to identify number patterns and rules
- Confidently order and compare numbers beyond 1000 when in a variety of contexts
- Accurately round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000 in context
- Add and subtract numbers with up to 4 digits using the formal written methods of column addition and subtraction
- Recall multiplication and division facts for tables up to 12 x 12
- Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally
- Multiply 2 digits and 3 digit numbers by a onedigit number using formal written layout

	Pupils will identify common electrical appliances and construct a simple series electrical circuit using basic components. They will also recognise some common insulators and conductors and associate metals as a conductor.		Pupils will explore the contributions made by the Roman civilisation to the modern world. They will explore the founding of this empire, its religion and daily life. They will explore its architecture and significant individuals such as Caesar.		Pupils will explore the climate of Mediterranean Europe. They will investigate the foods grown in southern Europe and its landscape and physical features including mountain systems, islands and major settlements.
Pupils will explore the states of matter which include solids, liquids and gases. Through observation and investigation, they will discover the main difference in the structures of each state is how close the particles are together.		They will explore the eruption of Mount Vesuvius which led to the destruction of the city of Pompeii, the story of Hannibal who crossed the Alps with his elephants and gladiators and chariots as Roman entertainment.		Pupils will explore Russia, which is the largest country in the world.
