As you will already be aware, as a school, we subscribe to TT Rock Stars. The website allows the KS2 children to practice their times tables through a competitive element. When they log on, they can select different areas known as arenas to complete a range of times table tests. As the teacher, we can set the times tables which we want the children to access. KS2 children should be using the TT Rockstars' log in on a regular basis as part of their school homework. If your child does not have access to a device to use, then please speak to your child's teacher as we do have devices in school which you can loan. In our hall, we have a display to record the top scores in each class, weekly certificates are awarded and children go on the Hall of Fame.



What are the benefits of Times Table Rock Stars?

- Incorrect answers are always immediately corrected in front of the pupil so that they start to associate the correct answer to every question
- The clever code behind the scenes works out which times tables facts each pupil is consistently taking longer to answer and then it gradually starts to present these facts more frequently until pupils have mastered them.
- It will also ask related division questions 20% of the time in order to reinforce division facts.



For our younger children, we also have Numbots which helps with the understanding, recall and fluency of mental addition and subtraction, so that children can confidently move from counting to calculating.



Reading is a lifelong skill which we try to develop as your child continues their journey through our school. We are keen at ALTS to develop a love of books and escapism as early as possible, which is why we use '**Reading Karate'** in KS2.



Reading Karate is a reward-based system for reading at home, where children move up through coloured 'belts' (wristbands) depending on how many 'reads' they have completed. We would greatly appreciate your support with this initiative, not only by listening to your child read, but by perhaps sharing some of your favourite books from your childhood with them too.
