In English, we have focussed this term on writing information texts. We have learnt about the structure of non-fiction texts and developed our ability to write

factually. The children created their own mythical dragon and decided upon its statistics. They then used this to independently apply the skills taught during this unit to write their own information text.

In Gymnastics, we have worked on developing our movement and posture to enable us to hold balances, perform jumps and rolls. We have needed to use empathy and communication to work as a pair to create a sequence of these skills to perform to others.

In Hockey, we have developed our knowledge of the fundamental skills of the game. We have improved our controlling, blocking and passing techniques.





In our Art lessons, we have looked at the art of Japan. We have covered many elements but I think all children were proud of the Sakura trees. We used mixed media and a variety of skills to create these trees. I am sure you'll agree their outcomes are fantastic.

In DT, we became designers and were set the challenge of designing an apron. We then learnt how to measure, cut and sew material to create our design. This was a challenge for all children but with resilience and determination all children developed their skills.

Science In Science, we have been learning about states of matters such as solids, liquids and gases. Did you know that 'Evaporation is when a liquid turns into gas?' stated Cassie and Ruby. Children have explored the properties of each and Investigated how states can change from solid to liquid when pressure is applied, such as when making ooze.




Can you guess which state of matter is represented by this human model?








Science

The Ambassadors lead and promote wellbeing throughout school, they drive the message forward and release the stigma around talking about challenging feelings and encourage people to talk.



What is Bullying?

Bullying is where a behaviour is negative, repeated and intentional. It is not when you just fall out with your friend but then soon make it up again.

Bullying can be physical, like kicking, hitting or punching. It can also be online, like sending nasty texts or sharing photos without permission. It can be direct to the person's face, or indirectly behind their backs. Bullying is usually carried out with the intention to hurt someone or to make them feel insecure and is repetitive - happens again and again.

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
